THE COST OF WAGES & FRINGE BENEFITS FOR A RAILROAD CLERK



The figures shown below illustrate the per-employee per-month cost to a railroad employer for the wages and benefits provided to each Railroad Clerk effective January 1,2007. The computations are based on the average national rate of \$22.59 per hour, and a work-year of 2,307* average composite straight-time equivalent hours. Hours include straight-time, overtime (at 1.5 ST hours for each OT hour) and all hours paid for time not worked such as vacation, personal leave, sick pay, jury duty, bereavement, etc.
