McCain Opposed Health Care for Millions of Children. McCain voted against reauthorizing the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) because he said it covered too many children. He then missed critical votes to provide an additional \$35 billion to cover 4 million more children. (H.R. 976, Vote #307, 8/2/07; Vote #353, 9/27/07; Vote #403, 11/1/07; Congressional Record, 8/2/07)



McCain Cut Billions from Medicare and Medicaid. McCain risked health care for seniors and low-income families by voting for billions in cuts to Medicare and \$14 billion in cuts for Medicaid. He also supported raising the eligibility age for Medicare and increasing seniors' premiums. (S. 1932, Vote #363, 12/21/05; S. 1932, Vote #287, 11/3/05; SCR 18, Vote #9, 3/17/05; SCR 18, Vote #58, 3/17/05)
